Call to Order:

Mayor Gaddy called the meeting to order at 6:15 p.m.

Invocation:

Councilwoman Janice Bartell-Prather offered the Invocation.

Approval of Minutes:

Mayor Pro-tem Sanders made a motion to accept the minutes with a second by Councilwoman Janice Bartell Prather that the minutes of the February 20, 2018, Finance and Town Council Meetings be approved as written. All voted aye.

Public Comments:

Mr. Richard Driscoll addressed Council concerning code enforcement. Mayor Gaddy stated the item would be discussed later during the meeting and his questions would probably be answered during the discussion.

New Business:

a. Capital Expenditure Request – Sewer Department

Mr. Sammie Robinson requested approval to purchase an auto crane for approximately \$15,181.00. The crane would be used to pull up the pumps out of the lift stations when repairs are needed. Councilman John McMeekin made a motion approving the request. Councilman Danny Miller seconded the motion and all voted aye.

b. Capital Expenditure Request – Gas Department

Mr. Trip Peak presented to Council a request for two hydraulic squeeze tools. Mr. Peak explained the tool is used to make necessary repairs to gas lines when we have gas leaks. Mr. Peak explained the department recently had a leak and had to borrow tools to repair the leak. Councilman McMeekin made a motion to

use the funds for the boring machine to purchase the squeeze tools. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Bartell-Prather. All voted aye.

Old Business:

Mr. Wood presented to Council a report from the Code Enforcement Officer Marvin Jeter. Mr. Wood explained the report and stated he had stressed to Chief Seibles and Officer Jeter that it is time to start issuing citations.

Mr. Wood updated Council in regard to the property located at 509 S. Congress St. Mr. Wood stated the County and the Town would jointly continue the clean-up; however, cost of disposal may be an issue. We may have to bill the property owner.

Other Business:

Councilman Miller made a motion to donate \$75.00 to the Fairfield Middle School Career Day from his crime prevention account. Mayor Pro-tem Sanders seconded the motion. All vote aye.

There were no items for executive session.


