**1. Attorney John Fantry** – Final Reading/Public Hearing of Ordinance #102114. Attorney Fantry expressed to Council that due to new regulations regarding the Clean Water Act, the Town needed to pass the new modifications and Ordinance #102114. Councilman Klaus made a motion to accept Ordinance #102114 with a second by Councilman Sanders. All voted aye.

### **Other Business**

1. Councilman Wilkes stated that he has been approached by walkers in the park asking that the Town install a porta jon . Councilman Wilkes said that the cost would be \$100 a month. Councilman Miller made a motion with a second by Councilman Klaus to install one on a two month trial basis.
2. Councilman Miller stated that the picnic shelters needed refurbishing.
3. Upon opening bids, Construction Resource Group was the low bidder for the 11<sup>th</sup> Street Pump Station. Councilman Clyde Sanders made a motion with a second by Councilman Klaus that Construction Resource receive the bid. All voted aye.
4. The Town of Winnsboro was asked to pay \$600 for a dinner for the Golf Managers at the 145 Club. Town Manager Wood stated that the Town will need invoices turned in. Councilman Sanders made a motion with a second by Councilman Wilkes to pay for the dinner.
5. Councilman Sanders asked Chief Lorick if the dress code was ready for enforcement and he stated that it was in place.
6. Councilman Miller asked Town Manager Wood and Chief Lorick to look at abandoned houses, cars, and use of drugs throughout the Town. Councilman Miller thanked Chief Lorick for working with the Sheriff's Department on this matter.
7. Councilman Sanders made a motion with a second by Councilman Klaus to move the November Council meeting to November 5<sup>th</sup> since Election Day is November 4<sup>th</sup>.


**Adjournment**
